TERMS OF REFERENCE

Background:

The Zanzibar Legal Services Centre (ZLSC) is a non-governmental, independent and non-profit making organization established to promote access to justice and advocacy for the respect and observance of human rights, popularization of the knowledge of law and production of publications in all areas of legal concern to the people of Zanzibar. The Centre was established in 1992 and was formerly registered as a Trust under the Land (Perpetual Successions) Decree of Zanzibar in May, 1992, but later it acquired a Certificate of Compliance under the Societies Act, 1995 (Act No. 6 of 1995).

Among the objectives of ZLSC is to promote and protect human rights in Zanzibar especially to marginalized groups. Therefore, following this aim the Centre has been conducting research and fact finding missions to monitor human rights situation in Zanzibar.

The Assignment

ZLSC invites application from experienced researcher and consultant to conduct a **case study** on the “Freedom of Information and Expression in Zanzibar”.

The qualified consultant shall:

- ✓ To put together legal materials on human rights, particularly in freedom of information and expression in Zanzibar (Unguja and Pemba) from 2015 to 2018, and produce a report scientifically.
- ✓ To indicate the legal borders between the United Republic of Tanzania and Zanzibar in this rights.
- ✓ To monitor and asses human rights situation in Zanzibar.
- ✓ To recommend on the better way in promoting human rights in Zanzibar.

Task to be accomplished:

The consultancy shall perform the following task:

- To conduct a case study in both Unguja and Pemba so as to monitor and collect data on the right of freedom of information and expression.
- Prepare the report in a manner as elaborated in a methodology.
- Citing all the key sources of information from each data provided in a report.
- The consultant must participate in all organized meetings and workshops for the purpose of collecting data.

Methodology

The consultancy after consultation with the ZLSC Executive Director regarding to this finding assignment, will produce the draft to her.

The consultancy will conduct data collection as per agreed methodology which is suitable for this assignment.

Duration

This work shall start immediately after signing the agreement and shall last for two weeks.
