PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1 OF 1969

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE LAND (DISTRIBUTION)
DECREE, 1966**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title. 1. This Decree may be cited as the Land (Distribution) (Amendment) Decree, 1969, and shall be read as one with the Land (Distribution) Decree, 1966, (hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree).

Decree No. 5 of 1966.

Insertion of new section 8. 2. The principal Decree is hereby amended by inserting immediately after section 7 the following new section to be numbered 8:-

“Grants of building land.

8.-(1) The President may in consultation with the Revolutionary Council grant land for building purposes.

(2) Every grant under this section shall be evidenced by a Certificate of Title in the form set out in the Schedule or to the like effect.

(3) Every Certificate of Title shall be deemed to contain provision to the following effect:-

(a) that the grantee binds himself to construct within a period of two years from the grant a building the minimum value of which shall be specified in the Certificate of Title;

(b) that the grantee will not rent the building constructed by him on the land without the permission of the Government.

(4) Every Certificate of Title shall be signed by the Principal Secretary, Ministry of Works, Communications and Power."

Insertion of Schedule to the Decree.

3. The principal Decree is hereby amended by inserting immediately after section 7 thereof the following Schedule:-

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 2 OF 1969

**A DECREE TO LEVY A SPECIAL DUTY ON CERTAIN CLOVES WHICH
ARE THE SUBJECT OF CONCLUDED CONTRACTS WITH FOREIGN
BUYERS AND TO RENDER SUCH CONTRACTS UNENFORCEABLE
UNTIL THE SPECIAL DUTY IS PAID**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Clove (Special Duty) Decree, 1969.

Scheduled contracts to be unenforceable, until special duty paid.

2. The contracts concluded by the buyers specified in the First Column of the Schedule and the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation (a public enterprise established under the Public Enterprise Decree, 1966) in so far as they relate to the sale of cloves of the amount specified in the Second Column of the Schedule shall be unenforceable by the buyers until a special duty calculated at the rate specified in the Third Column of the Schedule has been paid by the buyers or payment secured by them by an irrevocable Letter of Credit.

Export of scheduled cloves prohibited until special duty paid.

3. The export of the cloves covered by the contracts specified in the Schedule is hereby prohibited until the special duty has been paid or payment secured in the manner provided by section 2 and no action shall lie against the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation for its inability to fulfil any contract specified in the Schedule as a result of the provisions of this Decree.

Notification by buyers.

4. Should any scheduled buyer wish to enforce his contract on payment of the special duty he shall notify the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation in writing before the 31st March, 1969 of his intention so to do. In the absence of such notification being received by the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation by the said date it shall not be liable if it is unable to fulfil the contract.

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 3 OF 1969

A DECREE TO AMEND THE PENAL DECREE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.
Cap. 13. 1. This Decree may be cited as the Penal (Amendment) Decree, 1969 Council and shall be read as one with the Penal Decree (hereinafter referred to Cap. 13 as the principal Decree).

Section 248
amended. 2. Section 248 of the principal Decree is amended:-

(a) by adding in subsection (4) between the word and bracket “Executive” and the word “the” in the fifth line thereof the words “or” if the offender is a person employed in the public service and the thing stolen came into the possession of the offender by virtue of his employment; and

(b) by adding the following new subsection immediately after subsection (9):-

“Stealing of
cloves from
Z.S.T.C. (10) If cloves belonging to the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation (a public enterprise established under the Public Enterprise Decree, 1966) are stolen the offender shall be sentenced to death. In such a case the offender shall be tried by the Special Court to be appointed by the President.”

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE No. 4 OF 1969

**A DECREE TO PROVIDE FOR THE GRANT AND REGULATION OF
PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES PAYABLE TO MEMBERS OF
THE REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title. 1. This Decree may be cited as the Pensions (Members of the Revolutionary Council) Decree, 1969.

Interpretation. 2. In this Decree unless the context otherwise requires-

"Council" means the Revolutionary Council;

"Member" means a Member of the Revolutionary Council;

"qualifying service" means service as a Member of the Revolutionary Council.

Entitlement to pensions and gratuity. 3. A pension calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Entitlement Decree may be granted to any Member of the Council who has completed to five years of qualifying service:

Provided that no Member of the Council shall be entitled to a pension under the provisions of this Decree if by virtue of any service other than the qualifying service he is entitled to a pension, gratuity or retiring benefit.

Computation. 4.(1) A pension granted under this Decree shall be computed at the monthly rate of one-six hundredth of the monthly basic salary for each completed month of qualifying service.

(2) No pension granted under this Decree shall exceed two-thirds of the highest basic salary drawn by the member concerned during his period of qualifying service.

Commutation.

5. Any Member to whom a pension has been granted under this Decree may commute up to twenty-five per centum of such monthly pension at the equivalent of one hundred and fifty times the amount of the monthly pension commuted.

Pension payable in arrear.

6. Every pension payable under the provisions of this Decree shall be paid monthly in arrear.

President's approval.

7. No pension shall be payable under this Decree without the approval of the President.

Gratuity to dependant.

8.(1) Where a Member dies whilst still serving on the Council a gratuity may be granted to his dependant. The amount of gratuity shall be the amount the Member would have received had he commuted the pension he would have earned at the date of his death in accordance with the provisions of section 5.

(2) The President shall decide as to who is the person entitled to receive such gratuity as dependant.

Pensions not to be attachable.

9. The pension or gratuity granted under this Decree shall not be assignable or transferable except for the pupose of satisfying a debt due to the Government and shall not be liable to be attached, sequestered or levied upon for or in respect of any debt or claim except a debt due to the Government.

Member may be recalled.

10. The President may at any time recall a retired Member in receipt of a pension, to further serve the Council and in the event of such a recall any pension payable shall be suspended until the Member again ceases to serve the Council.

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE No. 5 OF 1969

**A DECREE TO APPLY THE UNION SALES TAX ACT, 1969
TO ZANZIBAR**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar, by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council, hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title and commencement.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Sales Tax Act 1969 (Application) Decree, 1969 and shall come into operation on the 20th June, 1969.

Interpretation.

2. In this Decree "the Act" means the Sales Tax Act, 1969 enacted by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.

Union Sales Tax Act, 1969 to apply to Zanzibar.

3-(1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) the Act shall apply to Zanzibar with effect from the 20th June, 1969 as if the said Act contained provision for its application to Zanzibar.

(2) In its application to Zanzibar references in the Act to Tanganyika shall be construed as references to Zanzibar.

Provisions of the Bill for the Union Sales Tax Act, 1969 to be deemed in force.

4. Notwithstanding that on the commencement of this Decree the Bill for the Sales Tax Act, 1969 may not have been passed by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania, the said Bill shall, for the purposes of this Decree, be deemed to have been duly passed and the said Act to have been duly enacted on the commencement of this Decree.

Application of subsidiary legislation.

5. Any subsidiary legislation made by the Minister under the provisions of the Act, or purporting to have been made, shall, in so far as they lawfully apply to Tanganyika, apply to Zanzibar with such modifications as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this Decree.

Imports from Tanganyika exempt from sales tax.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Act no tax shall be payable on any article contained in the Schedule to the Act imported from Tanganyika.

216B.

2. The Penal Decree is amended by inserting the following new section to be numbered 216B immediately after section 216A:-

“Removal of
tonsils.

216B.(1) Any person, not being a qualified medical practitioner, who removes the tonsils of another person shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a minimum term of five years.

(2) Where such removal of a person's tonsils directly causes his death, the person removing the tonsils shall be guilty of murder.”

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO.7 OF 1969

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE REGISTRATION OF CITIZENS
AND RESIDENTS DECREE, 1966**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Registration of Citizens and Residents (Amendment) Decree. 1969.

Insertion of new sections 10A and 10B. Decree No. 11 of 1966.

2. The Registration of Citizens and Residents Decree. 1966 is amended by inserting immediately after section 10 the following new sections to be numbered 10A and 10B respectively.

“Powers of Police officers.

10A.(1) It shall be lawful for any police officer to request any person to produce his registration card. Upon such request the person shall immediately produce his card or if he resides in the town. he shall direct the police officer to the place where he has kept the registration card in safe custody and produce it. Failure to produce the registration card in the manner aforesaid shall render the person liable to an instant fine of Shs. 10/-. The fine shall be paid to the police officer in charge of the nearest Police Station who will issue an official receipt therefor.

(2) Any person coming from the rural area into any town shall carry his registration card with him and upon request by any police officer shall immediately produce the registration card. Failure to do so shall render him liable to an instant fine of Shs. 10/-. The fine shall be paid to the police officer in charge of the nearest Police Station who will issue an official receipt therefor.

Prohibition of
taking registra-
tion of Zanzibar
or Pemba.

10B.(1) No person shall, when he leaves Zanzibar or Pemba, take his registration card with him. Upon departure from Zanzibar or Pemba, he will hand over his registration cards to an immigration officer in charge at the port of departure. Any person who takes away his registration card in contravention of this section shall have his registration card forfeited by the Commissioner of Police.

(2) The fact that a registration card is found outside Zanzibar or Pemba shall be evidence of the fact that the holder thereof took away his registration card in contravention of this section.”

(6) Every Minister, Head of Department, Manager of a public corporation or enterprise will be personally responsible for ensuring that no goods will be imported into Zanzibar, without reference to the Imports Council.”

The Zanzibar Insurance Corporation Order, 1969

IN EXERCISE of the powers vested in me by section 2 (1) of the Public Enterprise Decree, 1966, I hereby establish the following Public Enterprise with particulars thereof set hereunder: -

1. Name:
The Zanzibar Insurance Corporation.
2. Minister Responsible:
Minister of State, Office of the First Vice-President.
3. Objects:
 - (a) To carry on the business of insurance in all forms and branches whether now known or hereafter to be devised and to re-insure or counter-insure all or any of the risks undertaken by the Corporation and, in particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to carry on business of the following classes:-
 - (i) life assurance, annuity, sinking fund and capital redemption;
 - (ii) fire insurance;
 - (iii) accident insurance;
 - (iv) employers' liability and workmen's compensation insurance;
 - (v) motor vehicle insurance;
 - (vi) marine, aviation and transit insurance;
 - (b) to insure or guarantee commercial and general credits (including the guarantee of loans of bankers and others, trade debts, overdrafts, acceptances, promissory notes and all other debts and liabilities whether present or contingent), to indemnify sureties, guarantors and others against loss of every description, to guarantee moneys secured by or payable under or in respect of debentures, bonds, contracts, mortgages, charges, obligations and securities of any company, corporation or authority supreme, municipal, local or otherwise;

- (c) to undertake and execute the office of trustee, receiver and liquidator (whether official or otherwise). executor, administrate, committee, manager, attorney, delegate, substitute, treasurer and any other offices or situations of trust or confidence, both public and private, and to perform and carry out the duties, functions and business relating thereto and connected therewith, either gratuitously or otherwise, and generally to transact all kinds of trust and agency business, either gratuitously or otherwise;

- (g) to issue and deposit any securities which the Corporation has power to issue by way of mortgage to secure any sum and also by way of security for the performance of any contracts or obligations of the Corporation or of its customers or other persons or corporations having dealings with the Corporation or in whose business or undertakings the Corporation is interested, whether directly or indirectly;

- (j) to draw, make, accept, endorse, negotiate, discount and execute promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable or transferable instruments;
- (k) to purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the business, property, liabilities and transactions or any person, firm or corporation carrying any business which this Corporation is authorised to carry on, or the carrying on of which is calculated to benefit this Corporation or to advance its interests, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Corporation;
- (1) to do all or any of the above things in any part of the world, and either as principals, agents, trustees, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others, and either by or through attorneys, agents, sub-contractors, trustees or otherwise, and to promote the Corporation to be registered or recognised in any foreign country or place.
