PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1 OF 1971

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE STATE GOLDSMITHS AND
SILVERSMITHS DECREE, 1970**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : —

Short title.
Decree No.9
of 1970.

1. This Decree may be cited as the State Goldsmiths and Silversmiths (Amendment) Decree, 1971, and shall be read as one with the State Goldsmiths and Silversmiths Decree, 1970 (hereinafter referred to as the of principal Decree).

Insertion
of new
section 1A.

2. The principal Decree is amended by introducing the following new section to be numbered section 1 A.

“Appointment of special committee. 1A. There is hereby established a Special Committee for the purpose of this Decree consisting of a Chairman and members to be appointed by the President.”

of section 2.

3. In section 2 of the principal Decree a reference to “Bizanje” wherever it occurs shall be construed as a reference to the Special Committee established by section 1A.

Amendment
of section 4.

4. Section 4 of the principal Decree is amended -
- (a) by deleting therefrom the words “the Chairman of Trade and of Commerce” appearing in the first line thereof and substituting therefor the words “the Special Committee”;
 - (b) by deleting therefrom. the word “he” appearing in the second line thereof and substituting therefor the word “it”.

Insertion
of new
sections 4A,
4B and 4C.

5. The principal Decree is amended by inserting the following new sections immediately after section 4 to be numbered sections 4A, 4B and 4C respectively : —

“Bizanje to be sole importer. 4A. Bizanje shall continue to be the sole importer of gold and the Special Committee shall purchase its gold requirement from Bizanje.

Offences and penalties. 4B.(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to give or receive an order for the making, buy or sell, or (subject to the provisions of subsection (4)) have in his possession any article of gold where the gold has been mixed with another metal and a person who acts in contravention of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term of two months and the article of mixed gold in question shall be forfeited to the Government.

(2) Any person who is in possession of any article of gold at the date of the commencement of this Decree shall report details of such articles to the nearest police station. The officer in charge of the station on receiving such report shall make a list in triplicate of the articles of gold reported. Each copy of the list shall be signed by the police officer who will give the owner of the articles one copy, submit one copy to the Special Committee and file the third copy at the station.

(3) The report under subsection (2) shall be made on or

before a day to be appointed by the President. Failure to do so shall constitute an offence and a person found guilty shall on conviction be liable to a fine of one thousand shillings and the articles of gold in the possession of the offender shall be forfeited to the Government.

(4) A person who has on the date of the commencement of this Decree in his possession any article of gold where the gold has been mixed with another metal shall not be guilty of an offence under subsection (1) if such article has been reported to the nearest police station in accordance with the provisions of subsections (2) and (3) and is included in the signed list obtained from the police station.

(5) It shall be an offence for any person to be found in possession of any article of gold which is not on the signed list obtained from the police station or which is not supported by a certificate issued by a state shop stating that the article was bought at the state shop and giving details thereof. A person found guilty of such offence shall have the article of of gold forfeited to the Government.

4C. If a Peoples Court is satisfied by information on oath that there is reason to believe that a person has in his possession articles of gold in contravention of the provisions of this Decree, the court may issue a search warrant authorising any person named or referred to in the said warrant to search any such person and the premises occupied by such person.

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE STATE TRADING
DECREE, 1967**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : -

Short title.

I. This Decree may be cited as the State Trading (Amendment) Decree, 1971 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 2nd day of April, 1971 and shall be read as one with the State Trading Decree, 1967, hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree.

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 3 OF 1971

A DECREE TO AMEND THE TRADES LICENSING DECREE
(Cap. 37, 1934 Revised Edition)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : —

Short title.

Cap. 97
of 1934.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Trades Licensing (Amendment) Decree, 1971 and shall be read as one with the Trades Licensing Decree, hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1971.

section 8 A.

2. The principal Decree is amended by deleting therefrom section 8A and substituting therefor the following new section to be numbered 8A : —
“Issue of trading licence. 8A.(1) A trading licence for any trade or business shall only be granted to a co-operative body formed by families joining together with a view to distributing the wealth of the country equitably among all the people of Zanzibar.

(2) Any individual or firm at present running a trade or business is required to prepare an inventory of all the goods in their shop and must be prepared to hand over such list on a date to be appointed by the Chairman of Trade and Industry when the shop is required to be handed over to the Government. After such date no private individual or firm will be permitted to sell any goods or carry on any business.

(3) Any person who acts in contravention of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term of two years or to a fine of five thousand shillings or to both such fine and imprisonment.

(4) The following shall be exempted from the provisions of this section: —

The National Bank of Commerce.
The East African Airways Corporation.
The Zanzibar Wharfage Limited.
The National Insurance Corporation of Tanzania.

(5) The President may exempt any person or class of person from the provisions of this section.”

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE EMIGRATION CONTROL
DECREE, 1969**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree: —

Short title.
Decree
No. 9
of 1969.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Emigration Control (Amendment) Decree, 1971 and shall be read as one with the Emigration Control Decree, 1969, hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree.

Insertion

section 4
B.

2. The principal Decree is hereby amended by inserting immediately after section 4A the following section to be numbered 4B : —

“Unlawful 4B.(1) Any person who has emigrated Zanzibar —
presence.

- (a) on a one-way travel document; or
- (b) on a travel document issued for a specified period and has not returned after the expiry of that period; or
- (c) being a citizen while abroad acquires the nationality of a foreign country; or
- (d) without obtaining an exit visa required under this Decree,

is hereby declared to be a person whose presence in Zanzibar will be unlawful.

(2) If any of the above-mentioned emigrants is found in Zanzibar he shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction he shall be liable to a fine of five thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term of three years or to both such fine and imprisonment. Further the court trying such person shall order the person to leave Zanzibar. In case such a person is sentenced to imprisonment such order shall take effect from the date of expiry of the term of imprisonment.”

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 5 OF 1971

**A DECREE FURTHER TO AMEND THE EMIGRATION
CONTROL DECREE, 1969**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

1. This Decree may be cited as the Emigration Control (Amendment) (No. 2) Decree, 1971 and shall be read as one with the Emigration Control Decree, 1969, hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree.

2. The principal Decree is hereby amended -

(a) by deleting the full stop at the end of section 4B (1) and replacing it with a colon; and

(b) by adding the following proviso to subsection (1) of section 4B: -

“Provided that any person who has emigrated not earlier than three months prior to the coming into force of Decree No. 4 of 1971 (that is after the 14th day of February, 1971) on a travel document issued for a specified period and has not returned after expiry of that period may make an application for re-entry to any Regional Commissioner setting out the reasons for his failure to return within the specified period. If his application is approved and the person is granted permission to re-enter Zanzibar his presence in Zanzibar shall not be deemed to be unlawful.”

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 6 OF 1971

**A DECREE TO CONTROL THE CONSUMPTION OF CERTAIN
IMPORTED COMMODITIES WITH THE OBJECT OF ENCOURAGING
LOCAL PRODUCTION OF THESE COMMODITIES AND
THUS SAVING FOREIGN EXCHANGE**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree: -

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Control of Consumption of Scheduled Commodities Decree, 1971.

Control of
scheduled
commodity.

2.(1) The sale of the commodities specified in the Schedule to this Decree (hereinafter referred to as a scheduled commodity) shall be subject to control. A scheduled commodity shall be issued weekly and the amount issued to each person shall be according to the size of his family and the number of his dependants.

(2) The President may by order at any time amend the Schedule by adding thereto or deleting therefrom any commodity.

3. It shall be an offence for any person who has been issued with a scheduled commodity to sell the commodity to another person and for a person to buy a scheduled commodity from a person to whom the commodity has been issued. The seller and buyer of a scheduled commodity who has been found guilty of an offence shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment for a term of not less than three months and to corporal punishment of not less than seven strokes.

PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 7 OF 1971

**A DECREE TO PROHIBIT THE EXPORT OF SEEDS,
SEEDLINGS, CUTTINGS OR PLANTS OF
AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : -

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Prohibition of the Export of Seeds) Decree, 1971.

Prohibition
of export
and
offences.

2.(1) It shall be an offence for any person to export any seeds, seedlings, cuttings or plants of any agricultural produce. A person found guilty of an offence under this section shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term of twelve years.

(2) Any person who aids or abets another person in committing an offence under this section shall be deemed to have taken part in committing the offence and shall be guilty of the offence and may be charged with actually committing it.

(3) Any person who knowing that any person intends to commit an offence or knowing that a person has committed an offence against this section does not

information thereof with all reasonable despatch to an officer in charge of a Police Station shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term of three years.

(4) Any boat, dhow or other craft or any vehicle or other means of transport used in the commission of an offence under this section shall be forfeited to the Government.

3. Any police officer, agricultural officer, Chairman of the Afro Shirazi Party or volunteer appointed by the Afro-Shirazi Party may arrest without a warrant any person found committing an offence under this Decree. A person so arrested shall be taken to the nearest Police Station.

Attempts.

4. Any attempt to commit an offence under this Decree shall be punishable as if the offence has been committed.

5. Any person found in possession of any seeds, seedlings, cuttings or plants of any agricultural produce in circumstances which indicate that he intended to commit an offence under this Decree shall in the absence of any reasonable and satisfactory explanation be deemed to have committed an offence under this Decree.

2. Section 248 of the principal Decree is amended by deleting therefrom subsection (4) thereof and by replacing it by the following new subsection to be numbered subsection (4):-
“Stealing (4) If the thing stolen is the property of the Zanzibar Government (which expression shall include a Public Enterprise established under the Public Enterprise Decree, 1966, or a Decree No. Company the shares of which are wholly or partly owned by the Zanzibar Executive) the offender shall be liable to imprisonment for 1 of 1966. a term of not less than five years and corporal punishment not exceeding twenty four strokes.”

“Forfeiture of building where stolen teak has been used in the construction. 248A.(1) Where a person has been found guilty of theft of teak belonging to the Government and where the teak has been found used in any building the court shall in addition to passing any sentence order the forfeiture of the building to the Government.

(2) Where any stolen teak has been found used in the construction of any building the onus of giving a satisfactory explanation as to how he came in possession of the teak shall be on the owner of the building.”

1. This Decree may be cited as the Local Liquor (Amendment) Decree, 1971 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July, 1971.

2. The Native Liquor Decree is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word "Native" wherever it appears and substituting therefore the word 'local'.

“Sale of
bhang. 28A. (1) Any person who sells bhang or who has in his possession bhang for the purpose of sale shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term of ten years.

(2) A person found in possession of bhang shall be deemed to have been in possession of bhang for the purpose of sale and the onus of proving that the bhang was not for the purpose of sale shall lie on such person.”

“(1) Any person who, after the coming into operation of this Decree, opens, keeps or uses any place for carrying on a lottery for organises or takes any part in organising a lottery is guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years or to a fine not exceeding fifteen thousand shillings and any person who in any way participates in a lottery is guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding one thousand shillings.”

(b) by deleting the words “not so authorised” wherever they occur in subsection (2) and the word “unauthorised” where it appears in the proviso to subsection (2).

“(3) The captain or other person in charge of any boat, dhow or other craft engaged in the unlawful export of cloves shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be sentenced to death. The boat, dhow or other craft as the case may be shall be confiscated by this Decree”.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964. the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree: -

Decree No.
16 of 1962.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Entertainments Tax (Amendment) Decree, 1971 and shall be read as one with the Entertainments Tax Decree, 1962, hereinafter referred to as the principal Decree and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of July, 1971.

2. The principal Decree is hereby amended by adding immediately after section 7 the following new section to be numbered 7A:

“Share in the profit.
7A.(1) In addition to the tax payable under section 3 there shall be payable in every financial year by the proprietor of every cinema providing entertainment fifty per centum of the net profit realised by the proprietor. This profit shall be ascertained after all deductions in respect of expenses incurred in providing the entertainment including the tax levied under section 3.

(2) For the purpose of scrutinising the accounts of every proprietor providing entertainment there is hereby established a Committee consisting of not more than five members to be appointed by the President.

(3) The amount payable under this section shall be paid to the Accountant General at the end of every financial year expiring on the 30th. June in every year”.

**DECREE TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964. the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : -

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Youth Camps Decree, 1971.

Establish-

2.(1) All the existing youth camps mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby established for the purposes of this Decree.

(2) The functions of the youth camps shall be the training of citizens who have left school to serve the nation and in particular the employment of its members in various forms of agricultural activities.

(3) The President may at any time by order amend the Schedule by adding to or deleting from the list of youth camps.

3. Every citizen male or female who has just left school shall be required to serve in a youth camp for a period of at least two years.

4. During service in a youth camp a member shall be entitled to a remuneration of Shs. 150/- a month. Of this amount Shs. 60/- shall be paid to the

member, Shs. 89/- shall be deposited at the People's Bank in the name of the member and Sh. 1/- shall be paid as subscription to the Afro-Shirazi Party.

No employ-
ment without
service in
youth camp.

5.(1) No person who has left school after the coming into operation of this Decree will be employed in any Government Department or public Enterprise if such person has not completed satisfactory service in a youth camp for at least two years. On completion of such service he shall be issued with a certificate to show that he has fulfilled the requirement of this Decree.

(2) When such a person is employed in any Government Department or Public Enterprise after the coming into force of this Decree he shall be deemed to have completed National Service as required by the Decision of the Revolutionary Council taken in 1967.

Discipli-
nary rules.

6. The Chairman responsible for Youth Camps may from time to time issue orders prescribing disciplinary rules to be followed at every youth camp. Such rules may provide penalties for the breach thereof.

**A DECREE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
 GOVERNMENT ASSISTED CO-OPERATIVES**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President for Zanzibar by and with the advice and Consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree : —

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Government Assisted Co-operatives Decree, 1971.

Persons who may be members of the Government Assisted Co-operatives.

2. Every citizen where age is not less than 40 years and who is without employment and who has not been allotted an acre plot shall be eligible to join a co-operative society which will be assisted by the Government under the provisions of this Decree.

Application to register.

3.(1) Persons wishing to register under the provisions of this Decree should apply to the Chairnam responsible for Workers' Equality giving the following particulars:-

- (a) the proposed name of the co-operative society;
- (b) its registered address;
- (c) the names of members of the proposed co-operative society;
- (d) the place where it is proposed to carry on the business;

(2) When the Chairman responsible for Workers' Equality approves the application he shall send a copy thereof to the Chairman for Trade and Industry and a copy to the Secretary of the Revolutionary Council for the information of the Council.

Form of
assistance.

4.(1) Government assistance to a co-operative shall be in the form of goods and merchandise to be supplied to the co-operative and not in the form of financial assistance.

(2) Goods and merchandise so supplied will be sold by the co-operative in Zanzibar and their export shall be prohibited. A person contravening the provisions of this subsection shall be guilty of a misdemeanour.

(3) An accurate list shall be kept of the goods and merchandise supplied to every co-operative. The list shall specify the number and type of goods and merchandise supplied together with the cost thereof and the price at which the goods are to be sold.

(4) Every person in charge of a co-operative shall be responsible for maintaining proper accounts and preparing a statement at the end of every month showing—

- (a) the goods received and the cost thereof;
- (b) the goods sold and the price at which they were sold;
- (c) the balance of goods in stock and the price thereof;
- (d) the amount repayable to the Government representing the cost of the goods sold;
- (e) all other expenses incurred by the co-operative;
- (f) the net profit made by the co-operative.

Payment

5. All cash receipts by every co-operative shall be paid daily to an account of the co-operative to be maintained at the Peoples' Bank.

6. Officials of Bizanje shall be responsible for the distribution of goods and merchandise to every co-operative whereas officials of the Treasury shall be responsible for checking the monthly accounts.

7. The net profit of the co-operative shall be divided equally as income to its members provided that no member shall be in receipt of more than a sum to be determined by the Chairman for Workers Equality. If after the distribution of income to each member there is a surplus the co-operative shall increase its membership to the extent of the surplus.
