REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. I OF 1976

**DECREE TO AMEND THE PREVENTION OF CORRUPTION
DECREE, 1975**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President of Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Prevention of Corruption (Amendment Decree, 1975 and shall be read as one with the Prevention of Corruption Decree, 1975, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Decree.

Amendment
of section 4 of
the principal
Decree.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Decree is hereby amended by adding the following proviso at the end thereof:-

“Provided notwithstanding the provisions contained in this section, the Commission shall be empowered to receive a report from any member of the public in respect of any person suspected of having committed an offence against this Decree and to investigate the offence committed in the same manner as if such a report has been passed on by the Political Bureau for investigation by the Commission.”

Addition of
new section 4A.

3. The following new section is added immediately after section 4 to be numbered 4A:-

“Declaration
of property.

4A.(1) For the purpose of enabling the Political Bureau to have a complete record of each of the public officers and to consider and determine whether he/she is or is not acting or conducting himself/herself contrary to the provisions contained in this Decree, every public officer shall declare all the property in his/her possession or in the possession of his/her husband, wife or child whether he/she is the owner of such property or is holding such property on behalf of, or as agent of or as a trustee of another person and all the property in the possession of another person if such person is holding such property on behalf

of, or as agent of or as a trustee of such public officer, his/her husband, wife or child in a special form as described in the prescribed schedule.

(2) In the case of Afro-Shirazi Party leader the form so filled shall be delivered to the Central Committee of the Afro-Shirazi Party which will direct that the said form should be sent to the Political Bureau for its scrutiny.

(3) In the case of a public officer the form shall be handed over to the Secretary of the Revolutionary Council who shall submit it before the Revolutionary Council.”

Addition of new sections 12A, 12B and 12C.

4. The following new sections are added immediately after section 12 to be numbered 12A, 12B and 12C:-

“Power of arrest.

12A.(1) The Commission may in the course of its inquiry under this Decree arrest without a warrant any person suspected of having committed an offence under this Decree,

(2) A person so arrested shall be immediately taken to the nearest police station and handed over to the officer in charge of the station:

Provided that the person so arrested and handed over to the officer in charge of a police station shall be, without a reasonable delay, taken to the High Court where the Commission will have the power to request that such person. should be remanded in custody for such period as it may think necessary.

Immunity for members of the Commission.

12B. No civil or criminal proceedings shall be instituted against any member of the Commission for any steps taken by him in the execution of his duty:

Provided that any person may lodge a complaint in writing against any act or conduct of any member of the Commission before the Political Bureau which will be empowered to conduct an inquiry whether a member of the Commission against whom a complaint has been lodged acted or conducted himself in contravention of the provisions of this Decree. The Political Bureau shall then report its findings to the Chairman of the Afro-Shirazi Party and recommend to him measures to be taken.

Penalty for assaulting a member of the Commission.

12C. Any person who assaults, interferes with, molests, resists or obstructs any member of the Commission while in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction, shall be liable, to be sent to the Educational Centre for a period of not more than five years. In addition to that, the person so convicted, may lose his job.”

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE SPINSTERS (PROTECTION)
DECREE, 1970**

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Spinster (Protection) (Amendment) Decree, 1976 and shall be read as one with the Spinster (Protection) Decree, 1970, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Decree.

2. Section 5(1) of the Principal Decree is hereby amended by adding immediately after the words "hard labour" appearing in the last line thereof, the following new words:-

"In such a case the spinster shall be punishable as an abettor."

REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. 3 OF 1976

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE AGRICULTURAL
PRODUCE DECREE**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Amendment) Decree, 1976 and shall be read as one with the Agricultural Produce Decree and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 15th May, 1976.

Cap. 110.

Addition of
new section
10F.

2. The Agricultural Produce Decree is hereby amended by adding immediately after section 10E thereof the following new section to be numbered 10F:-

“Ban on
export of
coconuts.

10F.(1) No person shall export or cause or permit to be exported out of Zanzibar or Pemba coconuts whether husked or otherwise:

Provided that the Afro-Shirazi Party Head Office of Agriculture may in writing permit a person to take away with him as a present not more than ten coconuts in any one month.

(2) Any person who contravenes or attempts to contravene the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to be sent to an Educational Centre for a term not exceeding five years. In addition the coconuts shall be confiscated and handed over to the Department of Agriculture.”

REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. 4 OF 1976

**A DECREE TO ENABLE THE ESTABLISHMENT AND
REGISTRATION OF FISHING CO-OPERATIVE
SOCIETIES AND TO MAKE PROVISION FOR
GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE TO BE
GRANTED TO SUCH SOCIETIES**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

- Short title. 1. This Decree may be cited as the Fishing Co-operative Societies Decree, 1976.
- Appointment
of Registrar. 2.(1) The Registrar of Business Names appointed under the Registration of Business Names Decree, 1949 shall be the Registrar for the purpose of registering societies under this Decree.
- (2) The Registrar shall maintain a list of every registered society and keep a complete record of particulars relating to such society.
- Eligibility
for
registration. 3.(1) To be eligible for registration every society must own not less than four fishing vessels each of which customarily manned by not less than five registered fishermen who are actually engaged in the fishing activities.
- (2) A member of the society may be disqualified from membership if his behaviour is not in the best interest of or to the utmost benefit of the society.
- Establishment
of registered
society. 4. There shall be one registered society at every fishing station established under this Decree and the number of such stations in every Afro-Shirazi Party Branch shall not exceed three.

Application for registration.

5. Fishermen wishing to form a co-operative society shall apply on the form set out in the Schedule to this Decree to the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Fisheries which is hereby empowered to approve or reject such application.

Offices of the society.

6.(1) Each society shall choose from among its members a Chairman, Secretary and the Treasurer who, if approved by the Party Branch Committee on behalf of the Party and Afro-Shirazi Party Department for Equality on behalf of the Government, shall together run the affair of the society.

(2) Each society shall have an Advisory Committee which shall consist of the Chairman, Secretary and the Treasurer of the society and other members to be appointed by the society on the basis of two representatives from each vessel.

(3) The society shall be assisted by officials of the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Marine and Fisheries with whom the society will work in close co-operation. The Department will maintain a complete record of the activities of all such registered co-operative societies.

Application for registration.

7.(1) For the purpose of registration, an application shall be made to the Registrar signed by the Chairman, Secretary and the Treasurer of the society and shall give the following particulars:-

- (a) name of the proposed society;
- (b) the fishing station where the society will operate;
- (c) the name of the Afro-Shirazi Party Branch where the station situated;
- (d) the names and photographs of each of the members of the society and their full addresses.

(2) Every application shall be accompanied by:-

- (a) a statement signed by the Afro-Shirazi Party Branch Chairman and Secretary on behalf of the Committee to the effect that the members are in fact qualified local fishermen and actually live in the area within the branch's jurisdiction, and indicating the type of fishing the society will specialise in;
- (b) a certificate signed by an official of the office of Citizens Equality confirming that they are satisfied the members of the proposed society are all reliable and trustworthy.

Eligibility for loans.

8.(1) Every registered society shall be eligible to receive a loan from the Government through the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Marine and Fisheries.

(2) The loan to be provided by the Government to every society shall be in the form of vessels, equipment and other items required in the fishing industry.

Provided that such loan shall be limited to not more than two vessels and the necessary fishing nets and accessories normally required for the particular type of fishing indulged in by the society.

Interest free loan.

9. The loan shall be interest free and shall be repayable by installments at such rate as shown in the paragraph (c) of section 13 of this Decree.

Repayment of loans.

10. Any vessel or equipment used for fishing that has been surrendered with the approval of the Department of Marine and Fisheries to the society by the owner who has become a member of such society shall be regarded as an interest-free loan from such member to the society. Such loan shall be repayable by instalments of one-fifth of the value of a month's catch or three hundred shillings, whichever is the higher, proportionately paid to the creditors.

Bank accounts.

11. Every registered society shall operate its own bank accounts and all its cheques must bear the signature of the Chairman and Secretary of the Society and countersigned by the Afro-Shirazi Party Area Secretary of the area where the society operates or an assistant authorised by him to do so on his behalf.

Allocation of monies into bank account.

12.(1) All the money collected by the society on each day shall, after deducting 25% worth of the catch to be equally shared by the fishermen, be handed over to the Afro-Shirazi Party Area Secretary or his authorised representative not later than twenty-four hours after a day's business. The money will be further divided into three parts as follows:—

- (a) 25% which will be deposited in a Deposit Account;
- (b) 25% which will be deposited in a Reserve Account B;
- (c) 25% which will be deposited in a Loan Payment Account C of the society.

(2) The Afro-Shirazi Party Area Secretary not later than twenty-four hours after receipt of the amount shall cause the same to be sent to the People's Bank where the moneys will be deposited in the society's A, B and C accounts.

(3) The Area Secretary and his assistant shall not be allowed to withdraw money from those .accounts except in the manner as laid down by section 11 of this Decree.

Disposal of bank account.

13. The disposal of money collected by every registered society and deposited in accordance with the provisions of section 12 of this Decree, shall be as follows:-

- (a) 25 % of all the money deposited in the Deposit account A shall be divided among its members after every six months on equal basis;

(b) the money deposited in the Reserve Account B shall be used for repairing, running and maintaining the society's vessels, equipment and other property; and

(c) the Loan Payment Account C of every society shall be used for repaying the Government Loan and any other loan received by such society.

Meetings of societies.

14.(1) Every registered society shall hold not less than four meetings, one in each quarter of the year in order to review the progress, achievements and to deliberate on the issues affecting the society and make decisions on them.

Provided that no such meetings shall be held and no such decisions shall be implemented by the society without prior approval and sanction of the Branch Chairman and the Area Secretary, the former in consultation with the latter and the latter in consultation with the Chairman of the Afro-Shirazi Party Department for Marine and Fisheries.

(2) A meeting of every registered society shall be attended by a member of the Party Branch Committee and a representative of the Area Secretary's Office as observers and shall be presided over by the Chairman of the society. In the absence of the society's Chairman another member of the Committee present shall be nominated to preside over that particular meeting.

(3) The following persons shall in addition attend the meetings of every registered society and give opinions on issues raised at the meetings. But such persons shall not have the right to vote:-

(a) a representative of the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Marine and Fisheries;

(b) a person nominated by the Afro-Shirazi Party Chairman for Equality.

Application for loans.

15.(1) Every registered society wishing to receive a loan from the Government will apply for such loan to the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Marine and Fisheries giving the following particulars:-

(a) name of the society;

(b) name of fishing station where the society operates:

(c) name of the Afro-Shirazi Party Branch:

(d) name of the Chairman of the society:

(e) name of the Secretary;

(f) name of the Treasurer;

- (g) names of all the members of the society and places of residence;
- (h) names of the Committee members showing each of them against the name of the vessel he represents;
- (i) number of vessels and particulars of fishing equipment and materials used for fishing owned by the society and the type of fishing the society specializes in;
- (j) type of fish the society normally catches and the method of fishing undertaken by the society;
- (k) particulars of the loan required and any other Government assistance required; and
- (1) any related information required by the Afro-Shirazi Party of Marine and Fisheries.

(2) The application shall be signed by all the members of the society and will be submitted with copies of the photographs sent to the Registrar together with the member's citizenship cards which will later be returned to their owners.

Society to be body corporate.

16. Each society shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and shall have power:-

- (a) to enter into a contract;
- (b) to acquire, hold and dispose movable and immovable property;
- (c) to receive and disburse money;
- (d) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; and
- (e) to perform such other acts as bodies corporate may by law perform.

Power to make Regulations.

17. The Chairman for Marine and Fisheries in consultation with the Revolutionary Council may make Regulations for better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Decree.

REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. 5 OF 1976

**A DECREE TO ESTABLISH THE REGISTRATION OF CLOVES
AND COPRA PORTERS CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES AND TO
MAKE PROVISION FOR GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE TO
BE GRANTED TO SUCH SOCIETIES**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Registration of Cloves and Copra Porters Co-operative Societies Decree, 1976.

Appointment
of Registrar.

2.(1) The Registrar of Business Names appointed under the Registration of Business Names Decree, 1949 shall be the Registrar for the purpose of registering societies under this Decree.

(2) The Registrar shall maintain list of every registered society and keep a complete record of particulars relating to such society.

Eligibility
for
registration.

3.(1) To be eligible for registration every society must consist of not less than 20 persons who are engaged as porters for handling cloves or copra purchased by the Government at any port or godown in Zanzibar or Pemba.

Provided that persons employed by the Government or any Public Enterprise either on permanent or daily paid basis shall not be eligible to be members of the registered society.

(2) Every member of the society shall be a person who is above the age of eighteen years.

Establishment
of registered
society.

4. There shall be one registered society in every district established under this Decree.

Eligibility for membership.

5. Every person wishing to be a member of the registered society shall undergo a probationary period for not less than six months and shall be certified by a medical officer that he is fit to perform the duties which every member of the society is required to perform.

Disqualification of membership.

6. A member of the registered society may be disqualified from membership if his behaviour is not in the best interests of the society.

Application for co-operative society.

7. Porters wishing to form a co-operative society shall apply on the form set out in the Schedule to this Decree to the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Equality which is hereby empowered to approve or reject such application.

Officers of the society.

8.(1) Each society shall choose from among its members Chairman, secretary, and the treasurer who, if approved by the Department of Equality shall together run the affairs of the society.

(2) The society shall be assisted by officials of the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Equality with whom the society will work in close co-operation. The Department will maintain a complete record of the activities of all such registered co-operative societies.

Application for registration.

9.(1) For the purpose of registration an application shall be made to the Registrar signed by the chairman, secretary and the treasurer of the society and shall give the following particulars:-

(a) name of the proposed society;

(b) the place where the society will operate;

(c) names and photographs of each of the members of the society and their full addresses.

(2) Every application shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by an official of the Department of Equality confirming that they are satisfied that the members of the proposed society are all reliable and trustworthy.

Contribution by members.

10.(1) Every member of the society shall contribute ten per cent of his daily income towards the fund of the society.

(2) The contribution shall be paid immediately after a member has received his daily wage.

Eligibility for government assistance.

11.(1) Every registered society shall be eligible to receive financial assistance from the Government through the Afro-Shirazi Party Department of Equality.

(2) Financial assistance shall be provided by the Government to every society whenever a member retires from the society. In such an event the Government shall contribute an amount equal to one hundred per cent of the amount to which a member will be entitled to receive on retirement from the society. The Government's contribution and the member's entitlement shall be paid to the retiring member.

Control of the society's funds.

12. All monies received by the society shall be deposited in the bank by the treasurer of the society not later than two days after the receipt thereof. The chairman, secretary and the treasurer of the society shall be the signatories of the society's account but for the proper control of the registered society's funds all the cheques of the society shall be counter signed by the trustee of the society who shall be appointed by the society.

Meetings of societies.

13.(1) Every registered society shall meet at least once in each quarter of the year in order to review the progress, achievements and to deliberate on the issues affecting the affairs of the society and make decisions on them:

Provided that no such meetings shall be held and no such decisions shall be implemented by the society without prior approval and sanction of the Chairman of the Afro-Shirazi Party Department for Equality.

(2) The following persons shall attend the meetings of every registered society and give opinions on the issues raised at the meetings but shall not have the right to vote:-

- (a) a representative of the Zanzibar State Trading Corporation;
- (b) a person nominated by the Afro-Shirazi Party Chairman for Equality.

Society to be body incorporated.

14. Each society shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and shall have power:-

- (a) to enter into a contract;
- (b) to acquire, hold and dispose movable and immovable property;
- (c) to receive and disburse money;
- (d) to sue and be sued in its corporate name; and
- (e) to perform such other acts as bodies corporate may by law perform.

Power to make Regulations.

15. The Afro-Shirazi Party Chairman for Equality in consultation with the Revolutionary Council may make Regulations for better carrying out the purposes and provisions of this Decree.

Society's rules.

16. Every registered society will with consultation and approval of the Chairman of the Afro-Shirazi Party for Equality enact its own rules, rules which will bind its members in respect of the welfare, rights and duties of the members, utilisation of the society's funds and the conduct of meetings of the society.
