REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. I OF 1977

**A DECREE TO ESTABLISH REVOLUTIONARY COMMITTEES
THROUGHOUT ZANZIBAR AND PEMBA**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the President of Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:-

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Revolutionary Committees Decree, 1977 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1977.

Establishment of
Revolutionary
committee.

2.(1) There shall be established administrative organs throughout Zanzibar and Pemba to be known as Revolutionary Committees.

(2) There shall be one Revolutionary Committee in each of the following units:-

- (a) Region;
- (b) District;
- (c) Area;
- (d) Village or Ward;

Cells.

3. The basic administrative unit shall be cell. Each cell shall recommend a person who is genuine and reliable, selfless and impartial, interested in the welfare of the people, industrious and persistent, a hardworking worker and good leader to be appointed to the Ward or Village Revolutionary Committee. Each member of the Ward or Village Revolutionary Committee shall be in charge of governmental affairs in so far as they affect the cell.

Composition of
Revolutionary
Committee.

4.(1) The Revolutionary Committee for a Ward or Village shall consist of members of the Ward and Village Revolutionary Committee appointed at cell level.

(2) The Revolutionary Committee for an Area will consist of members of the Revolutionary Committee appointed at Ward and Village level, and three members one from youth, women and party organizations from each Ward or Village.

(3) The Revolutionary Committee for a District will consist of members of the Revolutionary Committee appointed at Area level, and will consist of three members one from youth, women and party organizations from each Area. It will also include members of the Revolutionary Council and one member from each department and Public Enterprise.

(4) The Revolutionary Committee for a Region shall consist of members of the Revolutionary Committee appointed at district level and will consist of three members, one from youth, women, Party organizations and one representative from each department or Public Enterprise in the district.

(5) The members of every Revolutionary Committee shall appoint Chairman from among themselves who will chair the meetings of such Committee and be responsible for the running of the affairs of the Committee. Similarly a Vice-Chairman and a secretary shall be appointed who will assist the Chairman in the execution of his duties except in the case of an Area or Region where the respective Party shall be the secretaries of the respective Revolutionary Committees.

Eligibility and condition of continued membership of Revolutionary Committees.

5.(1) To be eligible for membership of a Revolutionary Committee a person has to be:-

- (a) A citizen of Tanzania;
- (b) A member of the Party;
- (c) Resident in either Zanzibar or Pemba.

(2) Continued Membership of the Committee shall be subject to:-

- (a) Scrupulous observation of the Aims and Objects of the Party membership and leadership codes;
- (b) Regular attendance and strict punctuality at meetings of the committee;
- (c) Efficiency in work;
- (d) Dedicated service to the people;
- (e) Total commitment to the welfare of people and State.

Duties.

6.(1) The duties of every Revolutionary Committee shall be as follows:-

- (a) to direct the work of the Revolutionary Committee which are subordinate to them;
- (b) to assist in the maintenance of public order;
- (c) to ensure the observance of the laws and the protection of the rights of citizens;
- (d) to draw up budget and development plans for their respective regions or areas and within the budget and plans to control the income and expenditure and to supervise the implementation of development plans which have as their object the raising of the standard of living of the inhabitants of their respective units;
- (e) to ensure the implementation of agricultural and industrial development and other programmes;
- (f) generally to protect and ensure the implementation of Government policies in their respective regions or areas and to do such other works as the Government may from time to time direct;
- (g) to assess the material and other needs of the inhabitants of the Region or Area as the case may be and to ensure that these needs are satisfied on the basis of self-reliance;
- (h) to implement the policy of socialism.

(2) Every Revolutionary Committee shall have the following standing sub-committees:-

- (a) The Revolutionary Sub-Committee for Political and Financial Affairs which shall be responsible for all political and financial affairs in the area including the control of income and expenditure and which shall also be responsible for ensuring the protection of the rights of citizens and their full participation in what constitutes their lawful duties as citizens;
- (b) the Revolutionary Sub-Committee for Economic and Development Affairs shall be responsible for drawing up economic and development plans and programmes, helping the Ministries concerned in the supervision of State shops and co-operative societies and co-operating with the relevant Ministries and institutions in the supervision of agricultural, industrial and development projects and programmes with a view to ensuring efficiency, proper utilisation of manpower, machinery and raw material and increased production in the area of their jurisdiction. The Sub-Committee shall also be responsible for all economic, educational, cultural and social development in the area;

- (c) Revolutionary Sub-Committee for Defence, Security, Law and Order shall be responsible for ensuring the observance of peace, law and order, protection of citizens and their properties and assisting the law authorities and citizens in the prevention and elimination of crimes and assisting all residents in the area to be law abiding citizens.

Access to

Revolutionary
Council.

7. Every Regional and Area Revolutionary Committee shall have direct access to the Revolutionary Council through the Revolutionary Council's Revolutionary Committees for Political and Financial Affairs or for Defence, Security, Law and Order or the Secretary of the Revolutionary Council. It shall submit to the Revolutionary Council through its appropriate Revolutionary Committee its budget and development plans, problems, needs and requirements covering the area which falls under its jurisdiction. In drawing up the budget and development plans, problems, needs and requirements covering the area which falls under its jurisdiction. In drawing up the budget and development plans and in assessing the problems, needs and requirements of the inhabitants, the Revolutionary Sub-Committees shall have the duty to consider the views of all the Revolutionary Committee in the area. After considering these views the Regional and District Revolutionary Committees shall submit its recommendation to the Revolutionary Council's Revolutionary Committee for consideration and forwarding to the Revolutionary Council for action by the Revolutionary Council.

Power to call
leaders and
advisors.

8. Every Revolutionary Committee established under the provisions of section 2 of this Decree shall have power to call at its meetings through appropriate channels any Head of a Ministry, Department or Public Enterprise or any sectional Head to obtain from him clarification on any matter relating to its area and shall be entitled to obtain assistance from any qualified persons from any Ministry, Department or Public Enterprise in the execution of its duties.

Council's
Revolutionary
Committees.

9. There shall be established the following Revolutionary Committees of the Revolutionary Council whose members shall be appointed from among the members of the Council by the Chairman of the Council:-

- (a) Revolutionary Committee: Political and Financial Affairs;
- (b) Revolutionary Committee: Economic and Development Affairs;
- (c) Revolutionary Committee: Defence, Security, Law and Order, whose duties are set out in the Appointment of Chairmen (Amendment) Decree, 1977.

Ministerial
Revolutionary
Committee.

10.(1) Every Ministry shall have a Ministerial Revolutionary Committee consisting of:-

- (a) the Minister as Chairman;
- (b) the Assistant Minister/s

- (c) the Principal Secretary as Secretary;
 - (d) the Head of every Department or Public Enterprise in the Ministry who may be accompanied by between one and three representatives to assist him as observers;
 - (e) the Principal Accountant.
- (2) The Ministerial Revolutionary Committee shall be responsible for:-
- (a) examining the budget and studying and adapting the development plans and the working programmes submitted by departments and Public Enterprises including sections of the Departments under the Ministry:-
 - (b) planning the ministerial development plans, the working programmes and the budget;
 - (c) directing and supervising Government programmes and ensuring their implementation at every stage;
 - (d) ensuring that the duties and work of the Ministry are managed at an efficient level and in accordance with the programmes and the set targets;
 - (e) ensuring that there is a proper and national utilisation of manpower, machinery and materials;
 - (f) organising regular training programmes for all the workers;
 - (g) generally advising the Government on an overall development plan policy matters and co-ordinating with other Ministries to ensure a proper implementation of the programmes and plans.

Ministerial
Implementation
sub-committee.

11. Each Ministry shall have two Implementation Sub-Committees, one for Zanzibar and one for Pemba under their respective Junior Ministers who shall be the Chairman of the respective sub-committees, Members of the sub-committees shall be:-

- (a) The Assistant Principal Secretary;
- (b) The Assistant Head of every Department or Public Enterprise;
- (c) The Assistant Principal Accountant;
- (d) The Chairman of Party Branch;

(e) The Political Commissar.

Duties.

12. The duties of each Implementation Sub-Committee shall be:-

- (a) to be responsible for supervising the implementation of the budget and development plans and working programmes for all departments and platoons;
- (b) assuring the implementation of Government policies, programmes and decisions at every stage;
- (c) ensuring efficient implementation at all level of the directives of the Ministry;
- (d) ensuring a proper and national utilisation of manpower, machinery and tools and raw materials;
- (e) ensuring that training programmes are implemented most satisfactorily.

Departmental
Revolutionary
Committees.

13.(1) Every Department or Public Enterprise under a Ministry shall have a Departmental Revolutionary Committee consisting of:-

- (a) Department or Pubic Enterprise;
- (b) the Chairman of the Party Branch in the Department or Pubic Enterprise;
- (c) the Political Commissar;
- (d) the Departmental Accountant;
- (e) all Platoon Commanders each of whom may attend with his section leaders as observers to help him when required.

(2) The Departmental Revolutionary Committee shall have the same duties in relation to the Department and Public Enterprise as the Ministerial Revolutionary Committee has in relation to the Ministry.

Departmental
Implementation
Sub-commit-
tees.

14. Each Departmental Revolutionary Committee shall have two implementation Sub-Committees, one for Zanzibar and one for Pemba. Members of these Sub-Committees shall be:-

- (a) the Head of the Department or Public Enterprise and his senior assistant as respective Chairman;
- (b) all Platoon Commanders of the Department or Public Enterprise;

(c) the Political Commissar;

(d) the Party Branch Secretary.

Duties of
Departmental
Implementation
Committees.

15. The Departmental Implementation Committees have the same duties in relation to the Department and Public Enterprise as the Ministerial Implementation Committee has in relation to the Ministry.

Workers' units.

16. All workers in the service of the Government shall be divided into the following units:-

(a) Section;

(b) Platoon;

(c) Company;

(d) Battalion;

(e) Brigade.

Section
Leaders.

17. In every Department and Public Enterprise workers who are engaged in the same type of work shall be formed into a unit of not less than eight and not more than twelve to be known as a section. The workers in a Section shall choose a leader on the basis of skill, revolutionary spirit, commitment, ability to lead and conscientiousness in the performances of his duties. The Leader will serve as Commander of a section assisted in political matters by a member of the Party Branch Committee. These two together with the rest who will not be less than six and not more than ten other persons shall form the Section Committee in that section.

Responsibility.

18. It shall be the work of the Section Committee to ensure that discipline is observed, and everything is done orderly and is in good order, that a healthy climate exist among workers, and that attendance is punctual and regular. The Section shall also be responsible for initiating seminars and shall generally be responsible for co-operation between fellow workers and dealing with problems of the workers in their own section.

Platoon.

19. A Platoon shall consist of three to four sections of workers who perform the same or allied duties. The section forming the Platoon will recommend a Platoon Commander to the Departmental Revolutionary Committee based on the same qualifications as a Section Commander but at a higher level. The Platoon Commander will be assisted in political matters by the Party Branch Secretary and together with the Leaders of the section forming the Platoon will be leaders responsible for the proper implementation of duties assigned to the Platoon by the Departmental Revolutionary Committee.

Company. 20. A Company shall consist of four Platoons from all Department and Public Enterprise of workers performing the same or allied duties, and shall be under a Captain recommended by the Ministerial Revolutionary Committee and appointed by the relevant Revolutionary Committee of the Revolutionary Council.

Battalion. 21. A Battalion shall consist of all the Companies under the same Ministry under the Chairmanship of the Minister, The Battalion Command will consist of all Company Commanders each assisted by the Senior Platoon Commander under the Battalion Command appointed by the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council. There will be one joint meeting at least after every three months of the Battalion Command and Ministerial Headquarters in the first week of each third month.

Brigade. 22. There shall be two Brigades one in Zanzibar and one in Pemba. Each Brigade will consist of all the Battalions in Zanzibar and Pemba as the case may be. The Brigade Command will consist of all Battalion Commands for this purpose. The Brigade Commander shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council among members of the Revolutionary Council. The Brigade Command shall meet once every three months in the last week of each third month.

Interpretation. 23. In this Decree:-

"Party" means the Chama cha Mapinduzi;

"Public Enterprise" means an enterprise established under the Public Enterprise Decree, 1966 and shall include every Government Factory, Corporation, Statutory Body or Company the majority of the shares of which are held by the Government.

REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL DECREE NO. 2 OF 1977

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMEN
DECREE, 1972**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law 1964, the President of Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:

Short title. 1. This Decree may be cited as the Appointment of Chairmen (Amendment) Decree. 1977 and shall be read as one with the Appointment or Chairmen Decree, 1972 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Decree).

New section 2. The Principal Decree is amended by adding the following new section
4A. immediately after section 4 to be numbered 4A:-

“Revolutionary 4A.(1) There shall be the following Revolutionary Committees of the
Committees. Revolutionary Council whose members shall be appointed from among
members of the Revolutionary Council by the Chairman of the Revolutionary
Council:-

(a) Revolutionary Committee: Finance and Political Affairs;

(b) Revolutionary Committee: Economic and Development Affairs;

(c) Revolutionary Committee: Defence, Security, Law and Order.

(2) The duties of the Finance and Political Committees shall be:-

(a) to be responsible for the estimates of revenue and expenditure of all Government Ministries Departments and Public Enterprises and to ensure that the budgetary laws and directives are followed at every stage;

(b) to control Zanzibar's foreign reserves;

(c) to ensure a favourable balance of trade;

(d) to be overall responsible for maintenance, supervision and protection of Zanzibar's Finances;

(e) all Party matters concerning the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar; and

(f) All political affairs in Zanzibar as directed by the Chama cha Mapinduzi.

(3) The Economic and Development Committee shall be responsible for the development of the economy through:-

(a) Agricultural development;

(b) Industry;

(c) Forestry;

(d) Animal husbandry;

(e) Fisheries;

(f) External Trade;

(g) Internal Trade; and

(h) Good and efficient services and facilities for healthy recreation and constructive leisure.

(4) The Defence, Security, Law and Order Committee shall be responsible for:-

(a) the security of the country;

(b) the defence of the people;

(c) the defence of the economy;

(d) the defence of the material and social welfare of the people;

(e) the defence of the countries institutions and organizations:-

(The defence organs which are not under the Union will be under the President).

(f) the maintenance of Law and Order."

New section
5A.

3. The Principal Decree is amended by adding the following new section immediately after section 5 to be numbered 5A:-

5A. A Chairman, Deputy Chairman and Assistant Chairman shall normally be referred to as Minister, Junior Minister and Principal Secretary respectively except when he is referred to as Chairman of the Ministerial Revolutionary Committee and their Sub-Committees.

**A DECREE TO AMEND THE REVOLUTIONARY
COMMITTEES DECREE, 1977**

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred by the Legislative Powers Law, 1964, the Chairman of the Revolutionary Council by and with the advice and consent of the Revolutionary Council hereby makes the following Decree:

Short title.

1. This Decree may be cited as the Revolutionary Committees (Amendment) Decree, 1977 and shall be read as one with the Revolutionary Committees Decree, 1977, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Decree.

2. The Principal Decree is hereby amended by inserting immediately after section 8 the following new section to be numbered 8A:-

"Penalty for
obstructing a

Committee.

8A. Any person who interferes with, resists or obstructs any member of the Revolutionary Committee while executing his duties or in any way threatens or induces or destructs such a member of the Committee from discharging his duties as authorised by the principal Decree, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on conviction to be committed to an Educational Centre for a period of not less than five years. Similarly, any other person who aids and abets or is in any way accessory to the commission of this offence, shall be guilty of the offence and be liable on conviction to be committed to an Educational Centre for the same period."

3. The Principal Decree is hereby amended by inserting immediately after section 23 the following new section to be numbered 24:-

24. The Chairman may make Rules or Regulations.

**THE AIR NAVIGATION ORDER, 1976
Use of Government Aerodromes**

**Made under Article 54 of the Air Navigation
Order, 1952**

The Second Schedule to Government Notice No. 31 of 1952 (relating to the use of Government Aerodromes) is amended by introducing the following new landing fees:-

- (a) in respect of fees for a single landing of aircraft weight-
 - (i) not exceeding 40,000 lb. at the rate of Shs. 8/- per 1,000 lb. calculated to the nearest 1,000 lb.
 - (ii) exceeding 40,000 lb. but not exceeding 200,000 lb. at the rate of Shs. 10/- per 1,000 lb. calculated to the nearest 1,000 lb.
 - (iii) exceeding 200,000 lb. at the rate of Shs. 11/45 per 1,000 lb. calculated to the nearest 1,000 lb.
 - (iv) Helicopters will be charged half the above rate.

2. The Air Navigation Order, 1971 published as Legal Notice No. 3 of 1971 is hereby revoked.

3. This Notice shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January, 1977.

THE ROAD TRAFFIC DECREE (CAP. 135)

(Under Section 113)

**The Road Traffic (Registration and Identification of Vehicles)
Regulations, 1977**

Acting under the Powers vested in me by section 113 of the Road Traffic Decree, I, Ali Muhsin bin Ali, Chairman for ASP. Works, Roads and Telecommunications hereby make the following Regulations:-

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Registration and Identification of Vehicles) Regulations, 1977.

Registration
number.

2. With effect from the 1st of January, 1977 every motor vehicle registered under the Road Traffic Decree shall be assigned with the following registration number:-

- (a) MYP followed by index number in respect of a private vehicle;
- (b) MYT followed by index number in respect of a taxi cab;
- (c) MYM followed by index number in respect of a commercial vehicle and a trailer;
- (d) MYA followed by index number in respect of a passenger mini bus;
- (e) GN followed by index number in respect of all remaining public vehicles other than buses;
- (f) LR followed by index number in respect of a landrover;
- (g) MBS followed by index number in respect of buses;
- (h) MYK followed by index number in respect of vehicles belonging to foreign diplomats accredited in Zanzibar.
- (i) H followed by index number in respect of Honda motorcycles;
- (j) V followed by index number in respect of Vespa;
- (k) M followed by index number in respect of any other motorcycles.

Identification
plates.

3. The ground of every number plate of every motor vehicle shall be yellow and the distinctive letter or letters and number thereon shall be black.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH DECREE (CAP. 73)

**The Public health (Hawkers of Food)
(Amendment) Rules, 1977**

(Under Section 101)

1. These Rules may be cited as the Public Health (Hawkers of Food) (Amendment) Rules, 1977 and shall be read as one with the Public Health (Hawkers of Food) Rules, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules and shall be deemed to have come into force on 1st May, 1977.

2. Rule 5 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by inserting immediately after subsection (e) the following new subsection to be numbered (d):-

"(d) be issued only to persons who are aged and incapacitated or unable to do any employment or work for a living or have no other means of support and provided further they are recommended and approved by the Revolutionary Committee of the area where the trade of a hawker is to be carried out;."

3. Rule 8 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by inserting immediately after subsection (f) the following new subsection to be numbered (g)-

"(g) shall observe all regulation and or rules relating to price control on food items or public health as from time to time may be issued by the Ministers of Internal trade and Health aimed at facilitating the trade of hawkers of food."

THE TRADES LICENSING RULES, 1977

(Made Under Section 17)

1. These Rules may be cited as the Trade Licensing Rules, 1977.

2.(1) Every person applying for a trading licence shall submit his application form or forms to the Ministry of Internal Trade through the Revolutionary Committee of the area where such trade or business is to be carried out.

(2) The Revolutionary Committee shall submit its recommendations to the Ministry of Internal Trade with reasons for its approval or rejection.

(3) The Ministry of Internal Trade shall issue trading licences or otherwise only after the same have been scrutinised and endorsed by the Revolutionary Council's Committee for Economic and Development.

(4) Any person who either carries out trade or obtains a trades licence contrary to the procedure laid down in these Rules shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to be committed to an Educational Centre for a period of six months. In addition, the property involved in the trade or business shall be liable for confiscation by the Government.

IMPORTS CONTROL DECREE - CAP. 172

ORDER

Under Section 15 (1)

The Imports Control (Prohibited Imports) Order, 1977

1. This Order may be cited as the Imports Control (Prohibited Imports) Order, 1977 and shall be deemed to have come into force retrospectively on the 6th August, 1968.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires the expression "second-hand" goods shall mean goods imported into Zanzibar after use by previous owners outside Zanzibar.

3. The importation into Zanzibar of any second-hand goods of the following items is hereby declared prohibited:-

- (a) Motor vehicles of all types;
- (b) bicycles;
- (c) steamers;
- (d) dhows (mashua);
- (e) radios;
- (f) refrigerators;
- (g) any type of machinery;
- (h) spare parts for any of the above goods.

Provided that an employee in Government or public service or any other visitor may be allowed to bring into Zanzibar second-hand goods of the above items necessary for his own use on the understanding that such goods shall not be left or sold in Zanzibar when such employee or visitor leaves Zanzibar.

4. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to serve at an Educational Centre for a period not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding shillings ten thousand. In addition, the goods involved may be ordered to be forfeited as Government property.
